




Designed by Max Longin the Float Bed is based on the idea of the central point of rest to which everything leads in a pliable and soft way. This bed is has a design that is quite unique and is held in place by four stainless steel cords that are connected to a frame of wooden rods and steel bows which can support a weight of up to 2645 lbs. The bed is available in ash, beech, cherry, elm, maple, oak or walnut woods. Float can be easily assembled and dismantled into several parts, so it is easy to transport anywhere. Now for those of you who would like a really unique bed like this you might want to know that Float is available at a starting price of \$6200





Artist and furniture maker Sara Huston created this table with an indented space for magazines for those who to display reading materials on their coffee table but keep it neat at the same time. 

These coffee tables are for the true nerds among us. The top, a working Nintendo controller protected by a layer of glass, was truly a labor of love for its proud owner. The table on the bottom sports a feature that most of us instantly recognize: the periodic table of elements.

Each element is represented by a small sample of it safely embedded in acrylic so that even the dangerous elements can't hurt you



The design for these shelves is simply amazing. PLoP! shelves are made of corrugated cardboard to make them easy to carry around and set up in a new place. The shelves are collapsible, so whenever you need to hit the road quickly you can just remove your things from the shelves and fold it up. The units are also connectable, so you can have a long system of book shelves.



The <u>Calla chair</u> is also a very interesting chair, designed by Italian furniture maker Domodinamica. The Calla chair features polyurethane, which is wrapped around a durable frame, and comes dressed in a wide variety of stylish fabrics, or leather. The focal point of this chair is the arms. These can be manipulated to fit your size, style and comfort. As you can see from the image below, the chair can even be transformed into a '<u>chaise lounge</u>'. Beautiful.



Another <u>coffee table</u> that may be of interest, for it's dual purpose, is the Ego Coffee Table, which can be picked up and wheeled around the house. 

Utility furniture is the watch word in today's world with cramped small apartments that we all seem to live in. Responding to the need, John Glinister has come up with a unique furniture <u>design</u> that uses no screws or glue to assemble the seating unit. Hailed as the Slot Bench, the innovative furniture comprise of four main parts that are fabricated together by using a CNC machine. All, the users need to do is slot the parts together, supported by various small pieces, to assemble the bench. Though, the furniture comes with pre-attached cushions, there is a huge verity of colors and fabrics to pick from



Combining the functions of a clock with the utility of storage or shelf, designer Dzmitry Samal has come up with an innovative furniture unit named "Time Shelf" that other that providing ample space for storing different objects, otherwise lying all around the place, also keeps the users updated with time. Finished with plastic and MDF, the multifunctional shelf not just presents a neat and sleek design but also ensures durability. Combining two different functions in a single unit, the designer has added a new dimension to the home décor, without interfering with the utility of the common living space object







Designers continue to test the limits of plywood – a seemingly ubiquitous and relatively cheap material – in this case literally bending it to their will. These designs are complex and engaging yet strikingly easy to store, ship and assemble upon receipt. They come in a <u>variety of shapes and functions</u> and are stable once converted into their final formation.

While these flat-pack furniture designs might not be the height of fashionable design they are certainly cheap, easy and interesting alternatives to standard furniture. Over time, these techniques may become more viable as the actual designs evolve along with them.
